## World Youth Chess Championship (November 18-28)

Some 1450 young people are currently participating in this year's WYCC in Kemer-Antalya, Turkey, including 25 Canadians (Nikita Kraiouchkine had airline difficulties in Montreal) and 4 players from BC: Janak Awatramani and John Dokjnas (under 8), and Donovan Zhou and Peter Lai (under 10). After two rounds they have scored 1.5, 0, 1 (a bye), and 0.5 respectively, but there are many games yet to go: the event is an eleven-round Swiss by age category (U8, U10, U12, U14, U16, U18, with separate girls' categories). The top boards are being broadcast live (3 pm in Turkey, which translates into 5 am Vancouver time), but very few Canadians have been on those boards as yet. However, PGN files have begun to appear which contain all the games, but so far only round 1 is available (entering 700 games per round is a mammoth task). In the lower sections a fair number of the games are fragmentary, indicative of the notational vagaries of young juniors. Segments of video footage can also be found on the tournament website; that for round 2 includes a short shot of Janak Awatramani.

# Bindi Cheng Simultaneous Display (November 9)



## Jay Zhou writes:

On the afternoon of November 9, 2007 (the usual Friday club time), members of the UBC Chess Club received a special treat: a simul exhibition against FIDE Master Bindi Cheng. Thanks to Bindi and the club president Julian Doczi, the event was free to all club members. UBC Chess Club is one of the most active university chess clubs in Canada. It has more than 70 members. WFM Amy Wang and former BC junior champion Andrey Kostin are members of the club. The members are mainly undergraduate and graduate students of UBC. However, players from nearby communities are welcome to join for a fee of \$5 per year.

Barely recovered from recent illness, Bindi wanted the simul to go ahead, rather than re-schedule at another time. About twenty players joined the event, and some of them were surprised to find out that this FIDE master is only 17 years old, younger than almost all of them. Some were interested to know if Bindi has any IM norms (one) and in which tournament the norm was achieved (Canadian Open 2007). To let the players fully enjoy the event, passes were allowed and players who lost quickly were allowed to start another game. The simul lasted about two hours. At the end, Bindi won all the games.

# **BC JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP**

To no one's surprise, the winner of this year's B.C. Junior Championship was FM Bindi Cheng, who scored a perfect 5.0/5. Having a 350-point rating cushion helped, but a number of Bindi's potential challengers (the Han brothers, Richard Huang, Arik Milner) fell victim to upset results - all of them finished with 50%. This allowed three enterprising youngsters, Chang He Li, Tanraj Sohal, and Foster Tom, to pass them in the standings and tie for second. In the Reserve Section Dylan Parker and Jacob Jensen tied for first with 4.0/5, John Doknjas and Frank Cheng (Bindi's younger brother) tied for third, and Trevor Passey took the U1200 prize. In all twenty-seven juniors took part in the event, held at the New Westminster Sprott-Shaw College campus on the Remembrance Day weekend. Ken Jensen organized the tournament and was aided by a number of volunteers - thanks to all.
