# LEAP YEAR OPEN (February 29 - March 2)

Thirty-six players players participated in this five-round Swiss at the Vancouver Bridge Centre. In the Open Section IM Vicente Lee jr. breezed to first place with 4.5/5; his main competition was expected to be FM Bindi Cheng, but a couple of half-point byes meant the two of them never met. The tournament was enlivened/marred by a number of blunders, notably Lee-Daswani, Spears-Li, and B. Cheng-Kostin, which had a significant effect on the prize distribution: Lee took first, Dragoljub Milicevic and Andrey Kostin tied for second, and Changhe Li and Jack Cheng won the two U1900 prizes. In the U1600 Section Hector Rathburn-Mackay and Frank Cheng split first and second by drawing with each other and winning the rest of their games.

The event marked the local debut of two players new to these parts (Alexander Kromhout and Harrison Brooks), also the welcome return of others who have been inactive. In this particular chronological era February 29 is a Friday only every twenty-eight years, so the Leap Year Open will not occur again in this configuration until 2036 - be sure to circle the date now on your calendars ...


