As can be seen, thirty years ago the tournament was won by John Watson, better known these days as an author of classic works on the English and French Openings. He tied for second in Vancouver 75 and the First Keres Memorial but finally broke through in the Second, finishing ahead of reigning Canadian champion Peter Biyiasas. You are invited to play against FM Jack Yoos (2367 FIDE, 2417 CFC), many time BC Champion as well as sometime Canadian Chess Olympic team member on:

Saturday, May 26 at 12 Noon at the Vancouver Chess Centre, 201 - 1050 Kingsway, Vancouver.

Jack is flying here from Montreal for this special event.

Rules ===== - This is "Seirawan chess", using two new pieces (a Hawk: knight/bishop; and an Elephant: knight/rook):

The videos include Yasser explaining the difference between S-Chess and Fischer Random Chess, how S-Chess will be promoted around the world and why it was much more difficult giving a simultaneous in S-Chess than in standard chess (he scored 8-2-2 against under 2200 opposition...can Jack Yoos do better?).

Rules

- There is a limit of 12 boards. People may play as two- (or even three-) person teams, consulting, if there are more than 12 people who want to play.

- Standard plastic sets will be used; players should bring wooden bishops which we will mark with red and black tape (so people should come early).

- Jack has White in each game. If a game ends before 1:00 pm, you can start another, with colors reversed.

- No clocks - a player must move when Jack arrives at the board. Three passes are allowed.

- Scoresheets will be provided.

- There is NO entry fee. People might want to consider kindly donating to the Vancouver Chess Centre, which is providing the site at no cost (thanks Toni and Slaven).

Please remember, if all you want to do is drop by, meet GM Duncan Suttles, FM Bruce Harper (former 5-time BC Champion), and observe the simultaneous, you're encouraged and welcome to do this!
