## SUSAN POLGAR'S NATIONAL OPEN FOR GIRLS by Andrei Botez



Last weekend Alexandra Botez entered the first edition of the Susan Polgar National Open Chess Championship for Girls, which took place in Corpus Christi, Texas. She played in the grade 3-5 section together with ninety-seven other players. In the four sections there were 213 girls, so far the largest girls tournament in North-American history. In parallel with the main event there was a chess puzzle and a blitz tournament, also Susan Polgar gave a simultaneous display on forty boards. Alexandra tied for 3rd-10th place (8th after tie-breaks) with 5/6, finished 2nd in the puzzle tournament and 5th in the blitz.

As a news flash for Canadian Chess is the fact that Susan's sister WGM Sofia Polgar will move to Canada soon.

# Polgar,S - Botez,A [D45] Simul Corpus Christi, 27.01.2006 [Alexandra Botez]

1. d4 d5 2. c4 e6 3. Nc3 c6 4. e3

In some lines White does not want to develop the bishop along the c1-h6 diagonal, but will build up a centre with b2-b3 and Bc1-b2. Still that bishop looks kind of blocked now.

4...Nf6 5.Nf3 Bb4 6.Bd2 O-O 7.a3 Bxc3

7...Be7 was one option, but I did not want to play too defensive; another one could have been

7...Bd6 8.c5 Bc7 9.b4 Nbd7 10.Bd3 e5. This variation is nice because we both are attacking. Will try it some other time.

#### 8.Bxc3 b6 9.Bd3 Ba6

Developing the bad bishop. However I should have done that with the intention to exchange it.

## 10.b3 b5?? 11.c5!

It is better for White to block than to exchange here. My move 10 was a positional blunder.

#### 11...Nbd7 12.b4

Right now my a6 bishop is out of action.

12...Re8 13.a4 Qb8 (Of course not 13...bxa4?? 14.Bxa6 drops a piece) 14.Qe2 Ne4

I did not know what to do to get some play, so I decided to sacrifice a pawn.

# 15.Bxe4 dxe4 16.Ng5 Nf6 (16...f5? 17.Qh5) 17.a5 Qc7

To connect my rooks and bring the a8 rook to the centre.

## 18.Qc2 Rad8 19.Nxe4 Nxe4 20.Qxe4 f5

Weakens the e-pawn. I should have tried to improve my position by bringing Ba6-c8. That bishop is out of play and I kind of forgot about it...

## 21.Qf3 Qd7 22.O-O Qd5 23.Qe2

23.Qxd5 is bad because of 23...exd5 and now it doesn't really matter if Black is down a pawn because it is a blocked position with opposite-colour bishops

## 23...Rf8 24.f3 Qb3 25.Rac1 Rd7 26.e4

Now my Queen looks trapped.

#### 26...f4

This pawn seems weak now when I replay the game. I did not like the idea of opening the centre where White has all the pieces waiting for me.

#### 27.Rfd1 Rfd8 28.Rd3 e5 29.d5!



## 29...cxd5

Now white wins e5 and gets a pair of passed pawns. The game ends really fast now.

30.Bxe5 Qa4 31.c6 Re7 32.exd5 Qxb4 33.d6 Re6 34.Qa2 Kf7 35.d7 Qe7 36.Rd6 h6 37.Qd5 1-0

This position is lost for me.

#### **ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP 2006**

The preliminary round of the 2006 Elementary School Team Championship took place at St. John's School on January 28th. A total of twenty-nine teams from seventeen different schools participated in the five-round Swiss; each team could consist of upto six players, but only four played in each match.
