The ninety-third B.C. Championship was deservedly won by FM Jonathan Berry of Nanaimo with an undefeated 5.5/7 score. Jonathan quickly built up a commanding lead (one point after the first full day of play, a point and a half after the second), then drew his remaining two games to stay ahead of the surging Alfred Pechisker. Roger Patterson, Roman Jiganchine, and newcomer Ian MacKay (an FM from Chilliwack who was part of the Scottish team at the 1990 Olympiad) shared third place on 50%, a full two points behind the winner. The tournament had a rating spread of only fifty points (ignoring Ian MacKay's provisional rating, obtained by tying for third in the 2007 Keres), but despite this apparent closeness the draw quotient was low and decisive games the order of the day, a result of a number of the players being out-of-form or rusty.
