### **North American Open** (December 26-30)

Now in its twenty-second year, the North American Open is currently taking place at Bally's Casino Resort in Las Vegas. Those with a B.C. connection who are participating in the seven possible sections include Bindi Cheng, Jason Cao, Tanraj Sohal, Jeremy Hui, Jill Ding, Joe Roback, Jofrel Landingin, Severo Caluza, and Constantin Rotariu. ### **Groningen Chess Festival** (December 19-30)

A slightly older event is the Groningen (Holland) Chess Festival, this year celebrating its fiftieth anniversary. Two Canadians are playing in the "A" Group, Eric Hansen and Leon Piasetski. Eric has been unable to maintain the torrid form he demonstrated in recent tournaments but sits at plus two after six rounds, a point behind the leaders, while Leon has scored three points and had the satisfaction of beating GM Sabino Brunello in the fourth round. slowly and methodically as there is no hope of counterplay. **58...Nh4 59.Kd3 Nf3 60.h3 h4 61.a4** Slowly making small improvements and awaiting the results of my opponent's time trouble to materialize. **61...Ne1+ 62.Ke3 Nc2+ 63.Kf3 Ne1+ 64.Kg4** The king escorts the f-pawn and eyes the weak h-pawn. **64...Ng2 65.Kg5 Ke6 66.Nd4+ Kf7 67.Nc2!**



The N/g2 is conveniently dominated and the game is over. **67...Kg7 68.c4 Kf7 69.f5 Kf8 70.c5** Returning a pawn to create the winning passed pawn finally induced resignation. **1–0**
