2006 CANADIAN CLOSED CHAMPIONSHIP AND ZONAL

This nine-round Swiss, held at Tartu College in Toronto, is past the twothirds stage, with seven out of the nine rounds having been played. The current leader is Igor Zugic with 6/7, but close behind are Tomas Krnan and Leonid Gerzhoy on 5.5, followed a half-point back by Mark Bluvshtein, defending champion Pascal Charbonneau, Nikolay Noritsyn, Eric Lawson, and Michael Schleifer.

Our B.C. representatives are Louie Jiang and Roger Patterson. Louie began the tournament with a bang, defeating masters Vicente Lee Jr. and Ian Findlay in the first two rounds; he only has two draws to his account since then (presumably his opponents are now treating him more carefully), but his performance rating of 2266 is still well above his current rating. Roger has not had so happy a time of things, but there are two rounds left to improve matters.

(Nearly) all the games have been broadcast live by the MonRoi company. Tomorrow (Friday August 25) is a rest day, and the tournament wraps up this weekend with games at 10 am (PDT) on both Saturday and Sunday.

ZOLTAN SAROSY AT 100

The name Zoltan Sarosy will likely be unfamiliar to most chess players, yet he has been a prominent member of the correspondence chess community since coming to Canada over fifty years ago. A three-time Canadian champion, Sarosy was awarded the correspondence IM title in 1988 as an octogenarian; this year he celebrates another milestone - yesterday, August 23rd, Sarosy was one hundred years young. In recognition of his contributions to chess in Canada Zoltan Sarosy was earlier this year named as the 2006 inductee to the Canadian Chess Hall of Fame.

J. Ken MacDonald posted this appreciation on Chesstalk:

I know many Toronto chess players remember Zoltan as far back as the 1950s, when he used to sell chess sets and chess books and was a very active over-the-board and correspondence player, including many team events. Now hitting the century mark, Zoltan still leads a very active life. He walks daily and even does a little "work" at a local health club. He isn't as fast as he used to be, but he lives life on his own terms and to the fullest extent possible. Zoltan still comes downtown every five weeks on a Thursday to do his banking and we regularly meet for a coffee and a chat. He has great recall and even remembers bridge hands from 70 years ago! And he especially enjoys telling stories about his many encounters in chess tournaments. He speaks English, German, Hungarian, Spanish and French. He used to speak Serbian, but tells me that he recalls at most a couple of hundred words.

Zoltan still plays correspondence chess via e-mail, thanks to a computer he received five years ago or so. His stories about his experiences with his

computer are worthy of a stand-up comic! Ten-to-15 years ago, Zoltan told me that he would not begin any more CC events because he might not be around to finish them. This is now a standing joke between us. In March, 1951, three months after arriving in Toronto, Zoltan entered the Ontario championship. A newspaper clipping he saved recounts that Frank Anderson won the championship, but lost his individual game against Zoltan in the final round. Anderson had won the Ontario championship in 1948 and 1949 with Paul Vaitonis winning it in 1950. This is that winning game.
